MAIN STREET MAKEOVER: A THRILLING TRANSFORMATION FOR OUR COMMUNITY

In the heart of our small town lies Main Street—it is the backbone of our town, a gathering place where locals come together to shop, dine, and connect. Main Street plays a pivotal role in shaping our town's identity and fostering a sense of belonging for all who call it home. Now, with excitement buzzing in the air, we are thrilled to announce that Main Street is about to undergo a stunning makeover through infrastructure improvements. This endeavor promises not only to enhance the aesthetic appeal of our town but also to improve public safety and elevate the overall experience for residents, businesses, and visitors alike.

In small towns like ours, a sense of community is cherished, public safety is more than just a priority—it is a fundamental value. By investing in infrastructure improvements, our town demonstrates its commitment to protecting and enhancing the quality of life for all residents. You may have noticed the dynamic crosswalk installed on Main Street near Veteran Memorial Park. The city partnered with Summit Pacific Medical Center to cover the cost of this project to improve safety for pedestrians traveling between the campus of Learning to Grow and the hospital. The city also received a grant from the state to install more of these safety devices in several Main Street locations during the summer. The locations will span from the downtown business corridor at 4th Street to the school zone for the middle school and high school at 11th Street. Later this year, the decorative light poles will be retrofitted for LED lighting and additional light poles will be installed to improve lighting at street intersections.



Our small town is home to a diverse array of local businesses, and the Main Street makeover aims to provide them with the support they need to thrive. The city will not only improve lighting in our downtown business corridor, efforts to promote our community will also be improved. The banners on the street light poles will be revived to catch the attention and draw visitors from Eagles Landing to downtown Elma. The city will also expand its use of painted parking stalls on Main Street, and some side streets, to better manage the availability of parking spaces near our local businesses. The city will address aging landscaping along Main Street. Many of the trees have become severely damaged, grown too large for their space, or are causing damage to infrastructure. The existing trees will be cut down and replaced with new trees better suited for the spaces.

These enhancements will not only beautify our town but also create a more inviting and pedestrian-friendly environment for all.
